



Severe Dengue

On rare occasions the illness can progress to Severe Dengue, which can affect several organ systems resulting in bleeding (haemorrhage), and severe fluid depletion that can lead to shock and death.







Dengue Strains

There are four strains of Dengue, characterized as Dengue 1, 2 3 and 4 and every case of Dengue can be severe and life-threatening.

Persons can get dengue up to four times and the effects can be greater each time.







Protection from Dengue

- Monitor water storage containers for mosquito breeding
- Keep surroundings free of debris
- Destroy/treat potential mosquito breeding sites
- Wear protective clothing
- Use a DEET-containing mosquito repellant
- Stay indoors at dusk with windows and doors closed.

Breeding Sites

Drums



Tyres



Buckets



Animal feeding containers


Treatment for Dengue

Dengue fever is a mosquito-borne disease that is usually a mild illness in which a person may get a fever, headache, joint, and muscle pains.



Rest and adequate hydration are usually enough to see one through the period of illness.

The recommended treatment for the fever is acetaminophen/paracetamol.







Medication for Dengue

If you have Dengue, DO NOT use aspirin, diclofenac, ibuprofen, or any of the medications/pain relievers known as non-steroidal anti-inflammatory drugs (NSAIDs).

These drugs, when used to treat the fever in dengue, have been known to increase the severity of the disease.
